2.01 Lemoyne Nesbitt, Jr. - Application to Register

November 30, 2005 - Lemoyne Nesbitt, Jr. pleaded guilty to, and was convicted of, one count of trafficking in drugs (marijuana and cocaine) in violation of ORC 2925.03. The offense carried a juvenile specification, meaning that it was committed within the vicinity of one or more juveniles. The offense was a second degree felony. At the time, Mr. Nesbitt, Jr. also pleaded guilty to, and was convicted of, having weapons while under a disability in violation of ORC 2923.13. That crime was a third degree felony.

December 2, 2005 - Mr. Nesbitt, Jr. was sentenced to three years in prison for each conviction, with the sentences to be served concurrently. He was ordered to report to prison on January 3, 2006. (Journal Entry of the Court of Common Pleas in State of Ohio v. Nesbitt, Case No. CR-05-466795-A).

February 1, 2010 - Mr. Nesbitt, Jr. was released from post-release supervision by the Adult Parole Authority.

August 15, 2011 - The board voted to deny the application of Lemoyne Nesbitt, Jr. for funeral director registration based on the following provision:

ORC4717.14 (A)(4) The applicant or licensee has committed immoral or

unprofessional conduct. Specifically, Mr. Nesbitt Jr. pled guilty in the Court of Common Pleas in Cuyahoga County, Ohio to Trafficking Offenses and a Weapons Charge.

May 17, 2012 - The matter came before hearing officer Marc Myers. After consideration of all factors in the matter, Mr. Myers stated, *"I do not believe that this Board should grant Mr. Nesbitt, Jr.s' application at this time. Quite simply, his crimes were too serious and not enough time has passed since his release from prison and supervision by the Adult Parole Authority for this Board to grant him licensure."* Mr. Myers recommended the application of Lemoyne Nesbitt, Jr. for registration as a licensed funeral director be denied. He further recommended that Mr. Nesbitt, Jr. be permitted to apply for such licensure again after January 1, 2015, at which time the board can consider the application.

Mark A. Forney appeared before the Board on March 17, 2015, regarding his application to reciprocate his Funeral Director license from Washington and Missouri to Ohio. The board did not have motion regarding his application at that meeting. Mr. Forney has asked for his application to be on this agenda for deliberation and he would like to address the board.

Mr. Forney has not been to mortuary science school, but does have more than ten years funeral directing in the state of Missouri.

Mr. Forney was convicted by the Johnson County, Kansas, District Attorney's office on September 2, 1994, with two felonies, Unlawful Use of Credit Card and Theft. Mr. Forney was ordered to pay restitution, complete 50 hours of public service, and complete a 12 month diversion program. On January 26, 1995, the State of Kansas amended the terms of the diversion program by extending it for an additional 6 months. The diversion program was completed on April 16, 1996.

(6) The applicant has satisfactorily completed at least one year of apprenticeship under an embalmer licensed in this state and has assisted that person in embalming at least twenty-five dead human bodies.

(C) Any person who desires to be licensed as a funeral director shall apply to the board on a form provided by the board. The application shall include an initial license fee as set forth in section 4717.07 of the Revised Code and evidence, verified by oath and satisfactory to the board, that the applicant meets all of the following requirements:

(3) The applicant, following mortuary science college training described in division (A)(4) of this section, has satisfactorily completed a one-year apprenticeship under a licensed funeral director in this state and has assisted that person in directing at least twenty-five funerals.

Specifically, Victor Blankenship has not satisfactorily completed a one-year apprenticeship at this time, and require Mr. Blankenship to complete an additional 10 cases and at least a time period of two months, prior to consideration to terminate the apprenticeship.

Details of the Case:

05/12/2014 – Shawnte Hardin submitted an application for a new funeral home license to be titled Brady Funeral Home, which would to lease space from Donovan Bagnoli Funeral Home located at 339 Southwest Ave., Tallmadge, Ohio. Robert Brady was listed as the AIC on the application.

Included in the application was a letter from Larry Bagnoli granting permission to lease space to the Brady Funeral Home at their location. Larry Bagnoli claims he did not write, nor sign this letter and provided several copies of his signature. The signatures provided by Bagnoli do not match the handwriting on the letter.

05/19/2015 – The Board denied the application for licensure requested for the Brady Funeral Home, on the basis of the application was incomplete. Roberta Brady requested an administrative hearing for the denial, which is currently pending.

01/26/2015 – Inspector Anderson inspected the two Donovan Bagnoli Funeral Homes and the Donovan Bagnoli Crematory. Upon entering the facility located at 339 Southwest Ave., Tallmadge, OH, Inspector Anderson witnessed Shawnte Hardin, unlicensed, sitting behind a desk at the facility. Hardin had the attached business cards available indicating he is the Business Manager of "Hardin Family Funeral Services", serving Akron and Columbus, and provides a starting price for cremation and funeral services.

CONSUMER A:

03/18/2015 – Consumer A states her mother passed away on 11/24/2014 in Akron, OH. She first called a funeral home in Cleveland to handle her mothers' funeral service, but after realizing the prices were too high, decided to more her mother to Hardin Family Funeral Services.

A family friend recommended Shawnte Hardin to her. After speaking with him he told her he could do the services for about half the cost quoted by the first funeral home. Shawnte Hardin made the funeral arrangements with Consumer A at 339 Southwest Ave., Tallmadge, Ohio.

Hardin was the only person that she met with and he discussed all pricing and service details.

On 12/22/2014 she took her mother's clothing and a payment of \$335.00 to the funeral home and gave it to Shawnte Hardin. At the end of their meeting on 12/22/2014 she was introduced to a man named Jim Donovan. Hardin referred to him as his partner. The burial transit permit lists James M. Donovan as the Funeral Director.

Neither the first funeral home nor the cemetery have been paid, since the checks Hardin wrote to them both were returned as "Not Authorized Ineligible".

CONSUMERS B & C:

03/10/2015 – Consumer B states her grandmother passed away on 12/24/2014. She says her family heard of Shawnte Hardin because he handled their aunt's (Consumer A's mother) funeral arrangements and he did not charge a lot of money.

She state Hardin came to her grandmother's home in Cleveland, Ohio on 12/26/2014 and made funeral arrangements with her and her sister (Consumer C).

They met with Hardin again on 12/31/2014 at 339 Southwest Ave., Tallmadge, and Hardin was the only person they met with at that time. They filled out paperwork and assigned a policy to the funeral home. They never received a General Price List of a Statement of Goods and Services at any of the meetings when they discussed funeral arrangements.

They state they had every reason to believe Hardin was a funeral director. Hardin was the only person they met with and they felt he was in charge of everything.

They gave Hardin \$311.00 in cash as payment from the difference in the insurance policy and the total bill. They were provided a receipt for the payment (attached).

The death certificate for her mother lists Donovan Funeral Home and is signed by

James Donovan as the funeral service Licensee.

The burial transit permit lists James M. Donovan as the Funeral Director.

The cemetery has not been paid, since the check Hardin wrote was returned as "Not Authorized Ineligible".

James Donovan, Licensee, claims to have provided the services for both families, but goes on to state they have no relationship with Shawnte Hardin at this time.

They state they had every reason to believe Hardin was a funeral director. Hardin was the only person they met with and they felt he was in charge of everything.

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James Donovan, Licensee, claims to have provided the services for both families, but goes on to state they have no relationship with Shawnte Hardin at this time.
